Supported Housing Scheme

Supported housing is accommodation for people who are aged 60 and over, who can live on their own but who would like to have support close by.

We have 33 supported housing schemes across Dacorum with a range of self-contained flats and bungalows. Social gatherings and activities are often available within these schemes.

William Crook House is a purpose built supported scheme in Warners End, Hemel Hempstead.

Where is William Crook House?



William Crook House is on Green End Lane in Warners End. It is close to Stoneycroft shops where there are two small supermarkets, a chemist and several takeaways. Warners End Community Centre is also close by.

The nearest doctors' surgery is Parkwood Drive Surgery, which is less than five minutes' walk away.

How many flats are there?

There are 64 flats in William Crook House.

What facilities are there?

There is a communal lounge, television room and a kitchen for tenants to use. There is a communal garden with a patio area. There is a small car park for residents' cars and a mobility scooter store. There is also a guest room which can be booked for overnight visitors.

What activities do other tenants participate in?

The scheme is very active and the residents organise lots of social events. There is usually a group or activity running every day. They play bingo, darts and table tennis, have quiz nights and coffee mornings. We also run tablet courses to help tenants get online as part of our **Tenant Academy**, and a range of other free courses are available.
