Introduction:

The NPPF states that "The planning system is plan-led. Planning law requires that applications for planning permission must be determined in accordance with the development plan, unless material considerations indicate otherwise. This Framework is a material consideration in planning decisions." (para196).

For all 'saved' policies, the advice in the NPPF (Annex 1: Implementation) states that for policies adopted before 2004 (i.e. the Dacorum Borough Local Plan) "...... due weight should be given to relevant policies in existing plans according to their degree of consistency with this framework (the closer the policies in the plans to the policies in this framework, the greater the weight they may be given)." (para 215).

The following schedule lists all of the policies contained within the Dacorum Borough Local Plan 1991-2011 (column 1), alongside their status post adoption of the Core Strategy (column 2).

Where Dacorum Borough Local Plan policies are in-effect part superseded, they are listed as 'saved.' However, they will be considered in the context of the more up-to-date Core Strategy policy(ies) and the NPPF where appropriate.
